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## INTRODUCTION

In 1991, the AORN Foundation was established as the non-profit philanthropic arm of AORN to support nurses through education, research, and patient safety initiatives. Over the past thirty years, generous donations have enabled the Foundation to help tens of thousands of nurses achieve professional goals through several types of funding opportunities, including nearly 3,000 academic scholarships totaling more than \$3,500,000. In addition, the AORN Foundation supports nurses through professional development grants, educational events and resources. Each of these impactful programs are made possible with the help of individuals, chapters, and corporations coming together to assist nurses in all phases of their professional development, supporting safe surgery for every patient, every time.

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

2022 was filled with great successes and a greater understanding that there's so much more work to be done. Our members, chapters and industry partners engaged with the Foundation in a way that is helping us recover from the pandemic. However, we also are experiencing unprecedented demand for scholarships, education and additional resources from our nursing community.

We are steadfast in our mission to empower perioperative nurses who are advancing patient and workplace safety through education and research. In the last year the Foundation supported 85 nurses with academic scholarships, awarded more than 2,500 professional development grants for certification and membership, funded more than 300 Expo grants, provided educational support to 22 chapters across the nation and hosted more than 40 educational events

In regard to our focus on Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, 41 percent of scholarship recipients identified as nurses of color surpassing AORN's membership diversity rate of 30 percent. Representation matters, and the Foundation can provide the validation and support that helps nurses advance key initiatives such as healthcare equity and racial justice in their practice settings and communities.

All of this was accomplished with the understanding that the post-pandemic struggle is very real and something we are striving to overcome. Still, perioperative nurses will persevere—through staff shortages, equipment shortages, product delays, burnout and fatigue.

My most sincere and heartfelt thanks to all of you who have lifted up the perioperative nursing profession. It is an honor to work alongside you as we advance patient and workplace safety—every patient, every time.

To be successful, OR nurses must commit to lifelong learning and, thanks to the support of our donors, the AORN Foundation funds educational webinars, live events, scholarships, and grants to help assure their continued proficiency in providing safe care to their surgical patients.

In 2022, the AORN Foundation continued to influence the practice of thousands of perioperative nurses in every facility type when AORN subject matter experts brought the evidence-based *Guidelines* for Perioperative Practice to life in the presentation of Guidelines Workshops, Live and Virtual Events, and Webinars.

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
